

Adverb / Przysłówek

- przysłówki tworzymy dodając do przymiotnika końcówkę -ly
 - quick – quickly
 - careful – carefully

Od tej reguły są jednak pewne wyjątki:

- happy – happily y = i+ly
- gentle – gently -e zanika w przypadku gdy przymiotnik kończy się na -le
- extreme – extremely -e nie zanika w przypadku gdy przymiotnik kończy się na -e

Irregular forms / Formy nieregularne:

good – well	dobry - dobrze
fast – fast	szybki - szybko
hard – hard	ciężki - ciężko
early – early	wczesny - wcześniej
low – low	niski - nisko
far – far	daleki - daleko
long - long	długi - długo
late – late	późny – późno
near – near	bliski - blisko
right – right	właściwy – właściwie
high – high	wysoki - wysoko

Attention!

hardly = zaledwie, ledwie (almost not, used to say that something has only just happened)
lately = ostatnio (recently)
nearly = prawie (almost, but not quite or not completely)
highly = bardzo (very, to a high level or standard)

Attention!

We use adjective instead of adverb after the following verbs: be (być), look (wyglądać) , feel (czuć), see (widzieć), sound (brzmieć) , smell (pachnieć) , taste (smakować)
